# **About Maspeth**

The Maspeth Lions Club has been dedicated to serving the Maspeth Community for over 40 years. Issued in 1642 by the New Netherlands Colony, the original deed for the Maspeth area is the oldest on Long Island. Then, Maspeth was home to and named for the Mespeatches tribe of Native Americans. In the 1600's, Dutch & English colonists settled and founded Maspeth village, later absorbed by larger Newtown (Elmhurst). Today, the Maspeth Lions Club, as well many other neighborhood organizations proudly welcome visitors entering the community at the Memorial Plaza (at Grand Avenue & the LIE). Present-day Maspeth is a thriving community of families, great schools, lush parks, good restaurants and small shops & businesses.

Maspeth is a community rich in history. Mt. Olivet Cemetery, for example, dominates the area on the highest land in Maspeth. Mt. Olivet, because of its incredible views of the skyline, was once a popular weekend destination to 19th Century Manhattanites. The first meeting to discuss the formation of the cemetery was on March 26, 1850 at the house of James Maurice in Maspeth. Mt. Olivet's famous residents include cosmetics entrepreneur Helena Rubinstein Courielli and the 16 unidentified victims of the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire.

Maspeth also holds many long-standing neighborhood landmarks in the community, including Maspeth Federal Savings, Iavarone Bros., Papavero Funeral Home, Glendale Bake Shop, Grand Florist & Maspeth Press.

Maspeth is also known for great dining. Longstanding eateries in Maspeth like Fame Diner, O'Neills Restaurant, Connolly's Corner, Rosa's Pizza, Maspeth Pizza, Three Sons and many other ethnic restaurants provide some great dining experiences. Maspeth also is home to some of the best bake shops, including Russo Bakery and the Glendale Bake Shop.

Maspeth's Memorial Square, located in the heart of Maspeth at Grand Avenue & 69th Street, is a memorial ground of plaques, benches and memorials that honor Maspeth Residents, Veterans and the 19 Firefighters from Maspeth's FDNY Squad 288, who perished in 9-11. The Walk of Honor here pays tribute to Maspeth activists and visionaries who helped shape the community. Among those honored are Maspeth Lions Joseph M. Papavero, Joseph E. Sikorski and Raymond Smith.

Maspeth also has recreational areas to offer its families. These areas include the Frontera Park at 69th Street and Principe Park (formerly Maurice Park) at Maurice Avenue.

Catholic Churches are abundant throughout the Maspeth area. Local parishes include St. Stanislaus, Holy Cross, Transfiguration, St. Adalbert's and Our Lady of Hope. Many Catholic Maspeth families support these parishes, as well as their youth programs & ministries.
